What is the mission
of Serenity Place?

*Serenity Place exists to provide a safe,
comfortable and accessible environment
for recovery through 12-Step meetings held
by such groups as Alcoholics Anonymous,
Narcotics Anonymous, Al-Anon, Alateen
and other similar groups.*

*Serenity Place is a nonprofit organization
managed by its members through
a board of directors.*

History of Serenity Place

Serenity Place had its humble beginning during the late 1980s at the former Church of God of Prophecy at 601 North 9th Street in Bismarck. The old building was rendered unusable in an unfortunate, total-loss fire. The nonprofit organization acquired its current building in 2002 at 16th Street and Thayer Avenue.

- *Serenity Place* is currently supported by membership fees, group contributions and donations.
- All *Serenity Place* funds are used for maintenance, utilities and day-to-day expenses.
- Provides more than twenty meetings per week, serving 600-700 people.
- Not affiliated with any clinical, medical, religious, political or insurance organizations.

Future benefits

- Expansion of 12-Step Groups to include alcohol, narcotics, prescription drugs, eating disorders and gambling.
- Support related groups such as Co-dependency, Al-Anon, Alateen, Adult Children of Alcoholics and others.
- Fostering of community education and information.



Our plan

To build a new *Serenity Place* building
OR buy and retrofit an existing building that:

- provides more space including a community room and numerous meeting rooms.
- provides more space for parking.
- is ADA (American with Disabilities Act) compliant.
- is open more hours each day.
- is centrally located.
- has a kitchen to accommodate events for those in recovery and their families.

What will this cost?

PURCHASE AND REMODEL AN EXISTING BUILDING

Building Price: \$ 500,000 to \$ 750,000

Renovate Cost: \$ 200,000 to \$ 300,000

CONSTRUCT NEW BUILDING

Land Purchase (30,000-40,000 sq ft):
\$ 250,000 to \$ 350,000

Building Cost (6,000-8,000 sq ft):
\$1,000,000 to \$1,250,000
